Attendance

As mentioned a couple of weeks ago, the Government defines the threshold for Persistent Absence as 90% attendance. This may sound good attendance but a persistent absentee child misses 10% or more of their lessons in a year - that's 19 days of school a year! As a school, we are expected to follow up any student who falls below this attendance rate and support the student and their parents to improve upon this.

There is very strict criteria from the DfE regarding holiday absence during school time. As such we are not able to authorise any requests unless they meet the criteria for exceptional circumstances. This is available from the DfE website.
