Slimbridge Primary School Dog Policy: Holly, the Therapy Dog in Training

Introduction

Slimbridge Primary School is excited to introduce Holly, our beloved therapy dog in training, who will soon provide emotional support and assistance to our students and staff. Holly is currently undergoing specialised training to become a therapy dog, and her presence is expected to contribute positively to our school community. This policy outlines the guidelines and expectations for having Holly at our school, as well as the prohibition of other dogs on the school premises, in compliance with GCC (Gloucestershire County Council) rules.

Purpose

The purpose of having Holly, the therapy dog in training, at Slimbridge Primary School is to enhance the well-being and educational experience of our students and staff. Holly's presence, even during her training period, can help reduce anxiety, improve emotional resilience, and provide comfort and companionship to those in need. This policy ensures that Holly's activities align with our school's mission and values while maintaining a safe and inclusive environment.

Holly's Training and Qualifications

Holly is currently undergoing comprehensive training to become a certified therapy dog. She is diligently learning the necessary skills, behaviors, and socialisation techniques required to interact effectively and safely with individuals of all ages, including children and those with specific needs or allergies. Holly's training includes obedience training, therapy dog protocols, and appropriate health screenings to ensure her well-being and safety.

Responsibilities of the Dog Handler

Holly belongs to Mrs Hillman, the headteacher, and she is known as 'the dog handler'. Mrs Hillman is responsible for Holly's well-being and day-to-day care during her training period. As the dog handler, she also ensures that Holly is always properly supervised, maintains her health records, and manages her interactions with students and staff. Mrs Hillman is also responsible for ensuring that Holly's behaviour and conduct align with the highest standards of safety and professionalism.

Guidelines for Holly's Presence and Interactions

a. Training Sessions: Holly's training sessions will be scheduled to align with her specific training program. These sessions will occur at designated times, determined by the school administration, to minimise disruption to the regular school routine. Any changes to the schedule will be communicated to the school community in advance.

b. Controlled Interactions: As Holly is currently in training, her interactions with students and staff will be closely supervised and controlled. These interactions may be limited to certain individuals, small groups, or specific activities as arranged by teachers or approved by the school administration. Holly will be walked on a lead at lunch-time or play-time in a controlled manner.

c. Parental Consent: Students must receive permission from their parents or guardians before interacting with Holly during her training sessions or for therapy sessions or reading with Holly. The school allows parents or guardians to make informed decisions regarding their child's involvement and can choose to decline interaction.

d. Staff Engagement: Holly's presence during her training period is also intended to provide support and companionship to school staff. Staff members are welcome to seek comfort from Holly during their breaks or when needed.

e. Allergies and Phobias: Students and staff with known allergies or phobias related to dogs should inform the school administration or the headteacher, Mrs. Hillman and all due consideration will be taken to avoid

contact. Accommodations will be made to ensure their comfort and well-being without compromising Holly's presence at the school.

No Other Dogs Allowed on School Site

In compliance with GCC rules and to maintain the safety and focus on Holly's training, no other dogs, apart from Holly, are allowed on the school premises at any time. This includes the school buildings, playgrounds, and surrounding areas. This rule applies to students, parents, staff, and visitors alike, unless with the express permission of the headteacher.

Reporting Issues or Concerns

Any concerns or issues related to Holly's behavior, her presence on the school premises, or interactions with students or staff should be reported immediately to the school administration or the headteacher. All reports will be taken seriously and addressed promptly to ensure a safe and positive environment for everyone.

Review and Revision

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure its effectiveness and compliance with relevant regulations. Any necessary revisions will be made to address emerging needs and maintain the highest standards in promoting a positive school environment.

By adhering to this policy, Slimbridge Primary School aims to provide a supportive and inclusive atmosphere for students, staff, and the ongoing training of Holly as a therapy dog.
